

## JURY WILL GET STORY OF KILLING

*Woman's Account of Old  
Murder of F. Lewis Clark  
to be Retold in North*

Maraget Kelly will be taken to Santa Barbara tomorrow morning to appear before that county's grand jury to tell of her self-confessed knowledge of the asserted robbery and murder of F. Lewis Clark there in January of 1914.

Captain of Police Burnam and Detective-Lieutenant Colt, who have been here investigating assertions made by the woman to the effect that a mob with whom she was aligned at that time made away with the Spokane (Wash.) retired millionaire, said that Mrs. Kelly, booked at the County Jail here as Marie Ella Allen, will be taken to the fashionable resort city by automobile to recount to officials there her story of the asserted mysterious disappearance of Clark.

Detective-Lieutenant Sanderson, assigned by Captain of Detectives Bean to aid northern officials in checking Mrs. Kelly's fantastic story, said today he will question a man now held in the City Jail on a Wright Act charge as the result of the murder tale related to the police department by Mrs. Kelly.

In her narration of events that are said to have led up to Clark's asserted slaying, Mrs. Kelly named a man who is known to police as a "racketeer."

When calling at his residence last night officers learned that he now is held in City Jail on a Wright Act charge. A check of the records as to his identity verified their information and a lengthy interrogation of the man is planned for today. Officials refused to divulge his identity.
